### **WELCOME TO WINDSOR EARLY CHILDHOOD!!!**

Windsor Early Childhood includes 7 preschool classrooms for children ages 3-5 all housed at the Freer Elementary building. Five classrooms are Early Childhood Special Education classrooms. Children qualify for this program if they have an Individualized Education Program (IEP) for an educational disability identified through formal evaluation. In each of the ECSE classrooms, we place several typically developing peers. Our ECSE program is a half day model, Monday – Thursday. Morning session is 8:30-11:30 and the Afternoon session is 12:30 – 3:30. **NO CLASS ON FRIDAY.**

Freer Elementary also houses two Title One Preschool Classrooms. Children qualify for this program if they score below average in at least one area of the **DIAL-4** administered by PAT or meet other criteria such as Headstart eligibility, homelessness or English as a Second Language. One of the classrooms is also a half day model, Monday – Thursday. The other Title One Preschool Classroom is an extended day model, running 8:30 – 2:30, Monday – Thursday. Children are put on a spread sheet after qualifying for Title One. Those with the greatest need are placed in the extended day program. **NO CLASS ON FRIDAY.**

# PARENTS AS TEACHERS

**Beginning at the Beginning:** As a parent, you are your child's first and most important teacher. Your child will learn more during the early years than any other time in life. How your child grows and learns during these years – beginning at birth – will affect his or her later development and success in school.

**Free Services and Materials:** Parents as Teachers is a volunteer and free program that provides practical, effective help for all Missouri families with children birth to age five. It offers:

**1. Personal Visits** – Mindy Ford and Cathy Theiss, Certified Parent Educators trained in child development, provide home visits to families who qualify. They can help you understand each stage of your child's development and offer practical tips on ways to encourage learning.

**2. Screenings** – PAT offers periodic screening of overall development, language, hearing and vision. The goal is to provide a clear understanding of your child's growth and development. Call us for a screening if you:

- Have a developmental concern for your child.
- Would like a screening to place your child on the waiting list for a typical peer spot in one of the ECSE classes.
- Would like to see if your child qualifies for Title One Preschool.
- Would like confirmation that your child is developing appropriately.

**3. Referral Network** – PAT helps families link with special services, if needed, which are beyond the scope of this program.

**4. Group Activities** – PAT partners with ECSE, Title One to provide fun activities your family can attend. We also have Story Time with the parent educators several times during the year. Please see our calendar page for details.

Research has shown that children whose parents were involved in PAT were significantly advanced over their peers in language, social development, problem solving and intellectual abilities. Children whose parents were involved in PAT also scored significantly higher on standardized measures of reading and math achievement than did comparison children. ## SCHOOL SUPPLIES

Your child will need a backpack (big enough for a folder, papers, and art projects) with a change of clothes in it. Your child will be served a snack at school (not breakfast or lunch), in both the ECSE and Title One programs. We ask that you help us out by sending a package of store bought snack and drink for the class **each month**. If your child is not yet toilet trained, we ask that you send plenty of diapers each day (3-4), along with a container of wipes. If you prefer to send a package of diapers to keep at school, the teacher will let you know when they are running low, and you can send more. Your child's teacher will provide a more specific list of school supplies if more are needed. **Please leave personal belongings such as toys at home, unless requested for a "Toy Party" or Show and Tell.**

## HEALTH POLICIES – PARENT INFORMATION

The nurses of Windsor C-1 Schools would like to welcome you and your child. Our role as school nurses is to provide first aid and emergency care, to conduct health and developmental screenings, to participate in the prevention and control of communicable diseases, to promote wellness through health education, and to meet the special needs of any chronically ill or disabled child.

### Immunizations

According to Missouri State Law Section 167.181 RSMo, students must have the required immunizations before enrolling or attending school. Immunizations may be obtained at the Jefferson County Health Department in Arnold (phone 636-282-1010) or in Hillsboro (phone 636-942-3101). Appointments are necessary. Call for days and times.

### Exams

Physical Exams are recommended for all students entering Kindergarten and all students every two years thereafter. Dental and vision exams are also recommended for students each year. Please give a copy of these exams to the school nurse to be kept in your child's health file.

### **Health Care Plans**

Any parent who has a child with a medical diagnosis is asked to contact the school nurse to discuss their child's condition and to determine if a health care plan needs to be developed for school to accommodate his/her individual needs.

- **Asthma**

All students with a diagnosis of asthma should have an "Asthma Action Plan" on file in the school nurse's office. Please obtain a copy of this form for your physician to complete. The purpose of this plan is to assist the school nurse in managing your child's asthma at school.

- **Allergic Reactions / Anaphylaxis**

True medical emergencies are rare but may happen at school. In the case of a severe allergic reaction (anaphylaxis), time is of the essence.

Students with a known severe or potentially severe allergic reaction are strongly encouraged to have an "Allergy Action Plan" completed by their physician and kept on file in the nurse's office. The parent must also provide any medications required as part of that plan to the school nurse. It is the parent's responsibility to discuss with the appropriate school staff, including the school nurse, any accommodations that need to be made at school, especially in the case of food allergies. At the parent or school's request, a meeting can be arranged for this purpose.

## NOTICE

*Schools in this district are equipped with pre-filled epinephrine auto syringes and asthma-related medication. The school nurse or another employee trained and supervised by the school nurse may administer these medications when they believe, based on training, that the student is having a life-threatening anaphylactic reaction or asthma episode. In accordance with written protocols provided by the authorized prescriber, students authorized to carry and self-administer epinephrine or asthma medications, may do so in accordance with Board policy.*

**Illnesses**

In an attempt to control the spread of illness, any student will be sent home who has: a fever (100° F or greater), vomiting, diarrhea, or as otherwise determined in the best interest of the student and/or the classroom. **STUDENTS SHOULD BE FREE OF THESE PROBLEMS FOR 24 HOURS WITHOUT FEVER REDUCING MEDICATION BEFORE RETURNING TO SCHOOL.** Students with any illness or communicable disease will be allowed to attend school in accordance with their doctor's recommendation and/or guidelines of the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services.

**District Sponsored After-School Programs (e.g. Tutoring, Detention, Sports, etc.)**

For any student participating in a district sponsored after school program, parents should to discuss any medical needs that their child has with the assigned coach/teacher and/or the child's Section 504 or IEP team.

**Communicable Diseases**

In the event of any communicable disease, control measures and interventions will be implemented in accordance with state statutes governing disease control, and in consultation with the student's physician and the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services.

**Birthday Treats and School Parties (ADF-AP1)**

All birthday treats will be allowed only if ordered through the school district's contracted food service provider. A selection of treats available for purchase is provided by the food service provider. Birthday treats will be allergen safe for peanuts and tree nuts. The food service provider will accommodate other allergens when possible. No profit will be made by the food service provider on the sale of



birthday treats. For snacks brought to school for parties (Halloween and Valentine's Day parties), patrons will comply with policy EFEA, Distribution of Noncommercial Foods.

All forms are available for download online under the nursing tab on the district website. If you are unable to obtain these forms online, they will be available in the nurse's office.

We hope this information will help you understand some of the health policies of our district. Please do not hesitate to contact us if you have any questions, or if your child has any special need with which we can assist.

### **MEDICATION POLICY – PARENT INFORMATION**

This information is provided as a reference to parents regarding the district's medication policy. The policy in its entirety is available for review on the website under policy JHCD.

#### **Prescription Medication**

All prescription medication must be sent to school in a currently dated and labeled prescription bottle (request an extra bottle from the pharmacy) and accompanied by a signed **PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION AUTHORIZATION FORM.**

#### **Over-The-Counter Medication (Physician and Parental Consent Required)**

No over-the-counter medication (e.g. cough syrup, allergy meds, etc.) will be administered at school without a written consent/order from the student's physician. This order must state:

- Name of student
- Name of medication, dose, and time to be given
- How long it will be given an indication for use

All over-the-counter medication must be sent in the original manufacturer's labeled bottle and accompanied by a signed **OVER-THE-COUNTER MEDICATION AUTHORIZATION FORM.**

#### **Stock Medication**

The school district has secured the services of a physician to write standing orders to cover the use and administration of specific over-the-counter medications which are supplied by the school district. These include Acetaminophen, Ibuprofen, Antacids, Lozenges, and Menthol Cough Drops. Written parental consent on the "Student Health Referral Card" must be obtained before a stock medication is given.

In addition, there is a district policy in place that allows for the administration of epinephrine in the case of a severe allergic reaction and albuterol or respiratory emergency.

#### **Student Self-Administration**

Students are NOT allowed to carry any medication on their person for self-use, including asthma inhalers, without first consulting the school nurse regarding the district's policy.

#### **Sending Medication to School**

All medication must be brought to school by the student's parent or a parent designee (e.g. baby-sitter, neighbor, etc.). If the parent is unable to do this, the medication may be sent with the student, providing the following conditions are met:

1. The prescription or over-the-counter medication is sent in the correctly labeled bottle inside a sealed envelope, and
2. The parent must call the nurse/office and report that medication is being sent to school with a count of the number of pills sent.
3. When field trips are scheduled, students requiring emergency medications (Epi-pens, inhalers) must supply their own medications for the field trip. The school's emergency medications must remain at school.

**Piercings/Tattoos**

All piercings and tattoos must be taken care of at home. They will not be taken care of during school hours.

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**Policy EFEA (*Shared Foods in the School Environment*)**

In the interest of providing a safe and healthy environment, the Windsor C-1 School District prohibits the consumption of shared foods during the school day. Some medical conditions and allergic reactions to food ingredients pose a serious risk to student safety. This risk is higher when food ingredients are unknown or when appropriate food preparation conditions cannot be controlled. Therefore, only pre-packaged foods with nutritional labeling may be brought to school for student consumption. Home-prepared foods are not permitted or sold to students during the school day. This policy does not

pertain to students' individual lunches and/or snacks brought from home for personal consumption.

### **Clothing**

There is no formal dress code for early childhood, but we encourage you to dress your child appropriately for daily indoor and outdoor activities. Remember that children are encouraged to participate in all activities (including art and sensory activities), so please do not dress them in anything that you do not want to get dirty. Please remember to dress your child appropriately for the weather. We will go outside if the temperature is between 32 and 90 degrees. In an effort to eliminate some preventable injuries, it is requested that children wear closed toe shoes (not sandals or flip flops.).

### **Outdoor Recess Guidelines 2014-2015**

(As based on Children's Hospital Guidelines)

Temperature of 32 and above/Wind-chill above 25- Students may remain outdoors for the scheduled recess time

Temperature of 20-32/Wind-chill **not** less than 15- Students may be outdoors 10 min.

Temperature of 10-20/Wind-chill less than 15- Students may be outdoors 5 min.

Temperature of 95 or above/Heat Index is above 100- Students remain indoors

Red Air Quality Day- Students remain indoors

Orange Air Quality Day- Asthmatics must remain indoors

### **Inclement Weather/School Closing Alerts**

School closing for the Windsor C1 School District will be announced on local tv news stations (KSDK Channel 5, KMOV Channel 4, etc) and radio stations (KMOX 1120 AM and KJFF 1400 AM for example). The district

also has a snow chain and you will receive a recorded message on your family contact phone numbers.

## **PICK UP AND DROP OFF INFORMATION**

Early childhood special education students may have bus transportation provided by Windsor (both special education students and typical peer role models) as long as their residence, daycare or babysitter is located within the boundaries of the Windsor School District. Title One students must have transportation provided by their parents.

Title One: Please pull behind the building and a teacher will direct you when to stop your car. Please put your car in park and walk your child to the teacher or paraprofessional who will be waiting for you. For the half day program, drop off is at 8:30 and pick up will be at the same location at 11:30. Drop off is also in this same location for the afternoon program at 12:30, and for pick up at 3:30. The extended day Title One class has drop off in this same location behind the school at 8:30 and pick up at 2:30.

ECSE Class: If you will be bringing your child to school and picking them up, please pull into the drive in the front of the building and park, if possible. ECSE staff will come out at 8:30 for the A.M students and 12:30 for the P.M students. The ECSE classroom staff will bring the children outside at 11:30 for the morning class, and 3:30 for the afternoon class. **Teachers are supervising students during pick-up and drop-off, so please try to keep conversation with them to a minimum during this time for the safety of the students. Please feel free to email or call teachers with a question or concern.**

All doors at Freer Elementary are locked at all times, and are only accessible by staff. If you need to come to the classroom for any reason during the day, please either park and proceed to the office. (The front door has a “door bell” on a metal plate located to the right of the door on the farthest right.) You will receive a visitor pass and can then go to the classroom. If you are picking up your child early, the office can call our room and a staff member will bring your child to the office.

**If transportation plans will change for any reason please contact the bus garage (if your child receives bus transportation) at (636)464-4498 and your child’s teacher to inform them of the change.**

# **POSITIVE BEHAVIORAL SUPPORT FOR EARLY CHILDHOOD**

Windsor School District has adopted the Positive Behavioral Support system (PBS) for managing behavior. We have found that it works very well, even at the preschool level. One of the benefits of using PBS with our Early Childhood students is that they will be familiar with it when they go to kindergarten.

We have 3 expectations (rules) for everyone in our school:

- Be Respectful
- Be Responsible
- Be Safe

At the beginning of the school year, we spend quite a bit of time talking about what each of these words mean. During the school year as issues arise, we use puppets or role playing to remind students of the expectations. Children who are displaying the expectations receive “Feathers” (a paper cut out of an owl). These can either be large classroom feathers or smaller individual feathers. Classroom feathers are earned for appropriate group behavior in the hallway, playground, gym, etc. Individual feathers can be earned any time the teacher sees the child displaying one of the expectations. Feathers are posted on a tree inside the classroom. Classroom feathers are used to earn rewards such as pajama day, bring your favorite toy to school day, picnic outside, movie, etc.

We would like parents to reinforce our PBS efforts as much as possible. Please feel free to ask teachers questions regarding PBS as they arise.

## **ATTENDANCE POLICY**

Please call to inform your child's teacher and the bus garage (636-464-4498) as soon as you know your child will not be coming to school. We understand that children miss school due to illness and unforeseen events such as car trouble, over-sleeping, out of town guests visiting, doctor appointments, etc. However, if absences become excessive, (more than 8 days per quarter) a meeting with the parents will be held to discuss attendance concerns and to develop a plan to improve the child's attendance. Remember, developing

good attendance habits now will lay the foundation for good attendance once your child begins school.

### **COURT ORDERS/DIVORCE DECREES**

It is necessary to have custody papers on file if your child is not to be released to a non-custodial parent. Without custody papers, the school cannot prevent a non-custodial parent from taking a child.

### **CURRICULUM**

Our teachers have been through training in the Project Construct curriculum. This is the foundation for our program. We also reference the Missouri Early Childhood Standards and incorporate those into every aspect of our day. Please ask your child's teacher if you would like to understand more about the Project Construct philosophy or if you would like a copy of the Missouri Pre-K Standards.

### **SAMPLE SCHEDULE (P.M.)**

12:30 – 12:45 Arrival, teacher-led group activity (focusing on fine motor, math and literacy skills) and toileting

12:45 – 1:10 Circle time: Calendar, question of the day, weather, shapes/colors, ABC's, numbers/counting, nursery rhymes, poems and songs.

1:10 – 1:45 Snack, journals, puzzles, and books.

1:50 – 2:10 Special Classes: Art, Music, PE, Computer and Library.

2:10 – 2:30 Recess – Gross Motor

2:30 – 3:05 Centers: Blocks, dramatic play, art, sensory table, writing center, science, and computer.

3:05 – 3:30 Closing Circle: Songs, social skills lessons, and stories.
